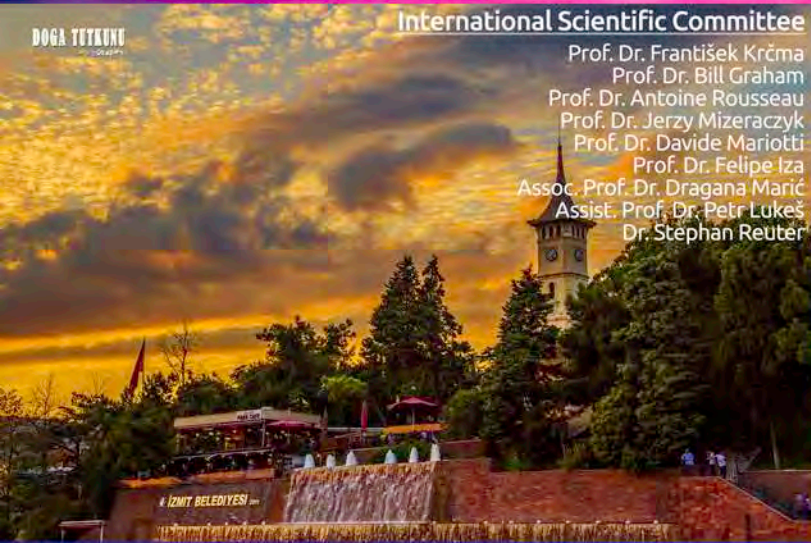

The 3rd Annual meeting of COST Action TD1208 will be held in Kocaeli. The city is a province east of the Marmara Sea and the Marmara Region which connects Asia and Europe. Research has shown that people from eras beyond history have lived in and around Izmit, which is the junction of the world's most important roads, since 3000 B.C. The first evidences of Izmit, in which people have continued to dwell to this day, can be traced back to the 12th century B.C.
